

## Indians are closing factories in the UK

Automotive manufacturing company Jaguar Land Rover, which belongs to the Indian company TATA confirmed on Thursday that it will close one of the plants. Only within 12-18 months will decide whether it's the Jaguar factory in Castle Bromwich, and Land Rover in Solihull.

Presenting the foundation of a new business plan, company officials assured that the decision would not involve compulsory redundancies group. Selected for closure factory production by 2015, trade unions announced that oppose the plans. Jaguar Land Rover is part of the Indian Tata Group, the UK has three plants - in addition to plants in Castle Bromwich and Solihull and in Halewood. In total they employ about 5 thousand. employees. Employment in Halewood, currently amounting to approximately 1.8 thousand. workers has increased by a further 800 people in connection with the decision to build a new model for Land Rover - LRX Concept. Tata acquired Jaguar and Land Rover from Ford in 2008, the Indian company sought to help the British Government under a special fund to support automotive industry, but both parties failed to agree on the conditions of its grant. In August, Tata announced that he won the private funds, withdrawing from talks with the government.
